ASH WEDNESDAY marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. During this season, many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and different spiritual disciplines. Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. Families (*adults and children*) will be invited to come forward to receive the Imposition of Ashes at a designated time during the service. The Ministers will lightly rub ashes in the sign of a cross onto each person’s forehead. Ashes signify mortality, repentance, purification and sorrow for our sins.

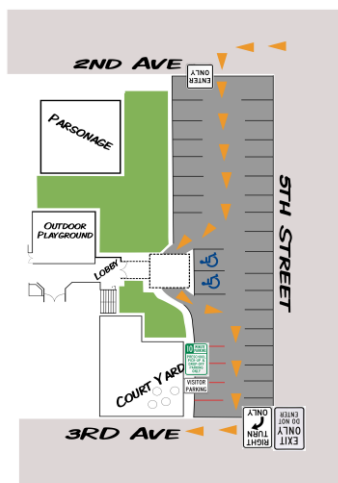

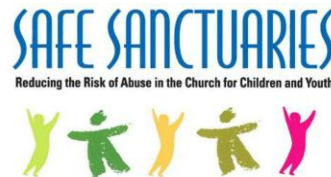
