DISCUSS

1. Consider this quote from Mark Twain: "The two most important days in your life are the day you were born, and the day you find out why."
 - Do you feel like you've "found out why" yet?
 - Inside the church, do you feel like you know your Masterpiece Mission--how God wants to guide 'Your Body in The Body'?

You are incredibly valuable to God--not just for the service you can do for Him, but because of the unique person He has made you to be. Take a look at what God says about you:

Psalm 139:14

I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made;
your works are **wonderful**,
I know that full well.

Prov 30:18-19

"There are three things that are **too amazing** for me,
four that I do not understand:
the way of an eagle in the sky,
the way of a snake on a rock,
the way of a ship on the high seas,
and the way of a man with a young woman.

We are God's unique creation, and God uses some powerful imagery to describe just how wonderful we are. We are more than wonderful; we are "too amazing" to be grasped. We are incomprehensible! The Hebrew word translated as "wonderful" in Psalm 139 is the same word that is translated as "too amazing" in Proverbs 30.¹

2. Is there anyone in the group who once had a hard time believing that you are "wonderful" and "too amazing," but has now grown to accept it? If so, can you share how God helped you see that over time?
3. Is there anyone in the group who is currently having a hard time believing that you are incomprehensible? If so, what is it about you in particular that keeps you from believing it?

In the book, *Find Your Place*, the authors note four common GPS Jammers:²

- The “Jungles of Africa” Jammer [fear]
- The “I don’t have anything to offer” Jammer [insecurity]
- The “I’m too busy” Jammer [ignorance/priorities]
- The “I’m already using my gifts” Jammer [comfort/complacency]

My (Brian’s) gift of teaching was refined and clarified during my time in seminary. I also had gifts of wisdom and shepherding, and my time in seminary provided training to strengthen those gifts too. Back then, I was certain that these were the only gifts God had given to me, and they served me well in my first church position as a Christian education pastor. When I left that position to take on another role in helping to transition a church from a traditional style to a more purpose-driven, mission focus, I found that my existing gift mix was inadequate. I was growing frustrated, and my friends encouraged me to use another gift they saw in me, one I didn’t see in myself—the gift of leadership. Honestly, any talk of leadership scared me. I was afraid to lead because I was afraid to fail. I didn’t know how to lead. I didn’t want to learn more about leadership because I was perfectly content using the gifts I had already developed! I even took a leadership ability assessment I found online, and it confirmed what I wanted to hear: I was no leader. The results indicated that I would do just fine as a chaplain for a small group of people and that I would probably never lead a church larger than two hundred people. That assessment gave me permission to rest where I was and not push any farther into exploring the gifts that others saw in me. God had a different plan.³
