Dear St. John's & Church Council,

After a season of much consideration & prayer, I believe it is time for my season of vocational ministry to come to a close. Thus, I am respectfully tendering my resignation from my role as Associate Pastor. This decision did not come easily, but Lauren and I sense that this is the right next step for our path as a family. We will seek to discern with Rev. John and the Council the exact timing of my exit to ensure a healthy transition and handoff of ministry responsibilities (early discussions projecting a transition sometime within the final week of July and first week of August).

I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to St. John's for taking a risk on some strangers and welcoming us in to serve, grow, and minister alongside you all. 



A CARING CHURCH? At St. John's we long to be a caring church. Most churches share this desire, but to actually be a caring church requires all of our participation in member-to-member care.
