Congratulations to St. John's Women's Guild --Celebrating 139 years of Women's Guild

On May 10, 1884 the Ladies Aid Society was established at St John's Church and has been an integral and invaluable part of the church since that date. In the 1920's, the Ladies Aid contributed over \$7,500 for construction, windows, and pews in the present-day sanctuary and \$6,000 toward construction of the present-day parsonage. The equivalent of those donations in today's money would be approximately \$204,000. In 1941 the name was changed to Women's Guild and, through the years, its women have continued caring for the church and its people inside and outside the walls of St John's. We look to the future with great anticipation and hope that we, the next generation of the St John's Women's Guild, will carry on the legacy of this great organization for many years to come. 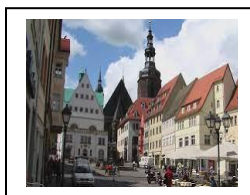

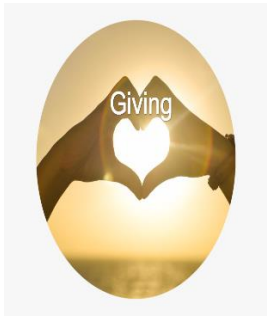

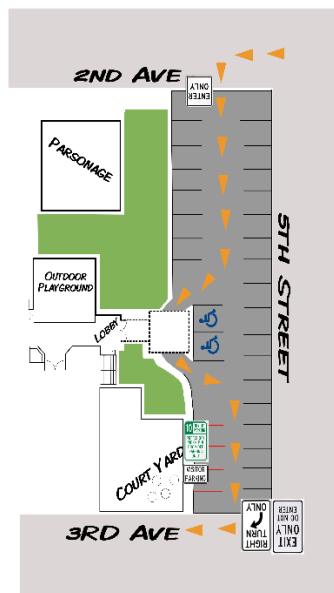

A CARING CHURCH? At St. John's we long to be a caring church. Most churches share this desire, but to actually be a caring church requires all of our participation in member-to-member care. First and foremost, it begins in the friendships and relationships you establish with your brothers and sisters in Christ.
